## Maths and English

This week in maths we have been looking at co-ordinates, plotting the vertices of shapes as they are reflected and translated in the x and y axis. The children have loved this topic. They have also drawn and interpreted line graphs and pie charts – telling the story of the line graph.

This week in English we have started our two week poetry topic which will culminate in a **poetry performance assembly on Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> March**. The children have loved reading, analysing and writing climate change poems.

## Home Learning

Spring 2 home learning is being sent home today – enjoy!

**Maths pre-learning:** recap how to find fractions of amounts e.g.  $\frac{3}{5}$  of £45 and how to compare fractions by converting so they have the same denominator e.g.  $\frac{2}{3}$  and  $\frac{7}{9}$  (convert  $\frac{2}{3}$  into ninths so multiplying by 3 =  $\frac{6}{9}$ ).

$$\frac{2}{3} < \frac{7}{9}.$$

**English pre-learning** – continue to learn a poem or verse from a poem off by heart to perform in assembly next Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> March.

This week's reading response – find a poem you love and copy out in your neatest handwriting. Then write 5 questions for a partner to answer about your poem (thinking about the type of questions we've been exploring in class e.g. synonyms and antonyms for tricky words, which is the most powerful word/image and why etc.

The spelling task this week is to spot and note down homophones e.g. witch and which
