Physical Development

- ☺ Outdoor physical activity daily.
- ☺ Daily Dough Disco
- ☺ Hungry Caterpillar Yoga - Monday pm.
- ☺ Indoor P.E - Thursday pm.
- ☺ Baking bread rolls.

'Literacy'

- ☺ Phonics - Letters and Sounds.
- ☺ Practise writing our names.
- ☺ Little Red Hen work mats and colouring sheets.
- ☺ Writing pet names in the role play.
- ☺ Play some phonic rhyming games.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

- ☺ Learn how to play nicely with other children.
- ☺ Learn to work co-operatively with other children and adults.
- ☺ Practise undressing/dressing for PE.

'Communication and Language'

- ☺ Read and discuss "The Little Red Hen".
- ☺ Singing familiar nursery rhymes. E.g. Humpty dumpty, Hey diddle diddle, One, two buckle my shoe.
- ☺ Share treasure bags. Ask and answer questions about the objects inside the bags.

Mathematics

- ☺ Counting how many children here each morning and take away number of children away.
- ☺ Learn number recognition.
- ☺ Begin to recognise numerals 1-10+.
- ☺ Use the language of more/less.

Understanding the World

- ☺ ICT - using the iPad's exploring drop and drag games.
- ☺ Use the classroom computers to develop simple mouse control.
- ☺ Learning about Harvest festival and the journey of what to bread.

Expressive Arts and Design

- ☺ Whole class singing and action games. E.g. Farmers in his den, There was a Princess long ago.
- ☺ Use imagination in role play and stories.
- ☺ Develop new role play area - The Farm
- ☺ Make labels for our creations made at our model making station.
