Learning this week

We've had a fantastic first week back at school. The children have been really engaged and enthusiastic about their learning.

English: This week we have been looking at different types of poetry. The children have read a range of poems, decided what type of poem it is and looked at the features of the poems. We have also been practising the poem 'Attacked by a banana' to perform in assembly on **Friday 3rd March**.

Maths: We have been looking at place value this week. The children have been able to use their knowledge of place value to solve problems. I was really impressed with the positive growth mind-set the children displayed whilst trying to solve the problems.

Topic: This week we have designed our own Roman Shields. We are looking forward to making them over the next few weeks.

Pre-learning

In science next week we will be continuing our learning on light. Please could you discuss what the terms **opaque**, **translucent** and **transparent** mean. If your child wants to bring in any examples of opaque, translucent or transparent everyday objects we would love to see them.
